## **Exhibition plans and partnerships**




We will look at the environmental, social and financial benefits of providing homes built through modern methods and supporting local government to limit its reliance on expensive, poor quality temporary accommodation. Context and terminology will be introduced and explained.

Working in partnership with Housing Festival (a think-and-do tank based in Bristol) we will co-curate a show that draws on their Social Rent Housing at Pace Playbook (2024), which demonstrates the opportunity for the public sector to incubate a new supply chain of factory-manufactured housing, while unlocking 'unlikely' land and rethinking the economics.

We will also explore the opportunity for the public sector and capital investors to rethink value, to encourage greater adoption and accelerate the delivery of MMC housing.

Alongside this we are looking for industry and private sector partners to share innovation and solutions, and contribute to telling the story of the systems and skills (existing and emerging) required. Case studies and 1:1 mock-ups of pioneering innovative solutions will be showcased.
